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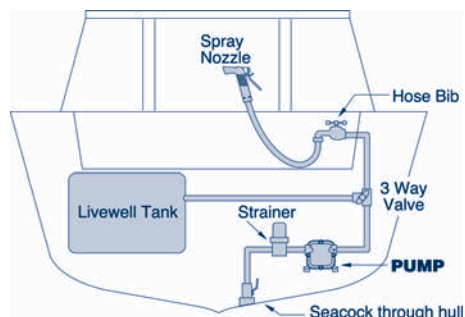
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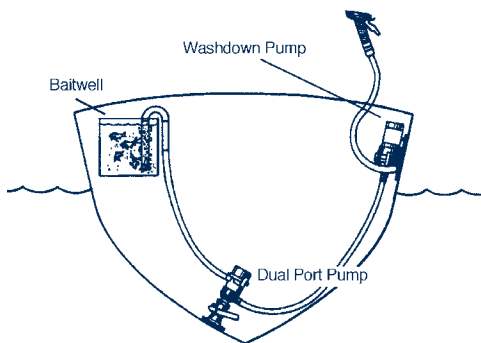
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CHOOSING THE RIGHT WASHDOWN PUMP



Washdown pumps come in two main varieties. High pressure, low flow models are typically self-priming and come with an automatic demand switch that controls their operation much like a water system pump. Low pressure, high flow models are operated by a manual switch and normally require flooded suction. Most washdown pumps can be utilized for baitwell operation. However, there are many models specifically designed for baitwell service.

DUAL PUMP SYSTEMS

AC DOCKSIDE BAITWELL/LIVEWELL PUMPS

These continuous duty pumps will lift up to 15 feet vertically and deliver up to 120 gallons per minute. They are ideal for dockside livewells or fishing pier bait houses. They come equipped with non-clogging open impellers and come standard with 115/230 vac motors. Three phase, TEFC, 50 hertz and explosion proof motors are also available.
