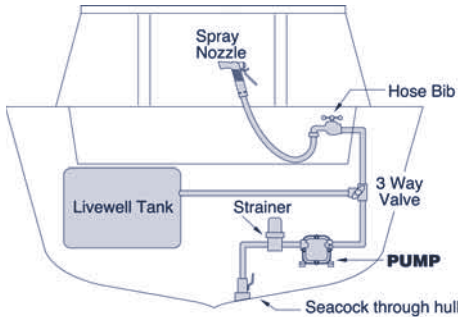

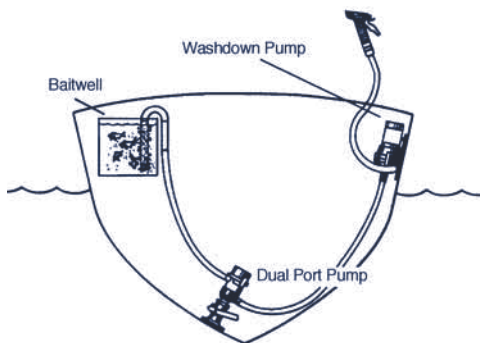

CHOOSING THE RIGHT WASHDOWN PUMP



Washdown pumps come in two main varieties. High pressure, low flow models are typically self-priming and come with an automatic demand switch that controls their operation much like a water system pump. Low pressure, high flow models are operated by a manual switch and normally require flooded suction. Most washdown pumps can be utilized for baitwell operation. However, there are many models specifically designed for baitwell service.

DUAL PUMP SYSTEMS



Provides quiet, high flow for your livewell at low amperage while giving you high-pressure washdown when you demand it! See top of page 23 for details!

WASHDOWN HOSE COILS WITH ENCLOSURES

These clever designs allow you to mount a hose coil enclosure flush into a deck, vertically on a bulkhead or horizontally in the cockpit. Plumb the enclosure directly to a high volume washdown pump and you'll have on-demand water where and when you need it. See page 25 for more information.
